The study has different parts undertaken based on Canadian index of Well-being.

The information has been obtained by: Observation, Gathering of information and Execution of application of the measuring instrument.

The survey was pre-designed in form of questionnaire. The questionnaire was filled in two forms of hard and soft copy (paper and online).

The results were entered as data in the database and the results came out online. The analysis was made based on those results.

The total sample for this research was 74 residents.

This analysis will help in the development of proposals seeking action to improve the relationships between different organizations concerned with the neighbourhood.

I. INTRODUCTION

The Survey of Community Index of Wellbeing 2014 is done by a group of newcomer women from communities across Toronto and participants in the Immigrant Women Integration Program of the Centre for Community Learning and Development. This survey is based on the idea that the community services and life conditions in their particular St. James Town can impact how people feel and think about the community, their personal well-being, their commitment to community, and overall life satisfaction.

The survey was done in Toronto's diverse network of St. James Towns, including several Priority St. James Towns. It was a necessary assessment survey as part of the process of understanding people's overall well-being and also their sense of belonging in their St. James Town.

- Strengthening the ties between immigrant and native residents of the area by encouraging participation and mingling.
